Maryland American Legion Boys State

In Maryland, Boys State is conducted annually and typically begins on Fathers Day and runs through the following Saturday. To be eligible for Boys State,



a youth must be a male who have successfully completed their junior year in high school and not have entered their senior year of high school. Any boy who has previously attended a Boys State is not eligible.

Applications may be obtained through local high school class counselors or by downloading an application by clicking <u>here</u> .

Completed applications should be sent to American Legion Post 295 by, April 15th. Applications will not be accepted after May 15th.

American Legion Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for high school students. It is a participatory program where each participant becomes a part of the operation of his local, county and state

government. Boys State has been a program of The American Legion since 1935 when it organized to counter the Fascist inspired Young Pioneer Camps.

The program was the idea of two Illinois Legionnaires, Hayes Kennedy and Harold Card, who organized the first Boys State at the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield. The American Legion Auxiliary sponsors a similar program for young ladies called Girls State. At American Legion Boys State, participants are exposed to the rights and privileges, the duties and the responsibilities of a franchised citizen. The training is objective and practical with city, county and state governments operated by the students elected to the various offices.

Activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, chorus and recreational programs. High school juniors are selected by local American Legion posts to attend the program. In most cases, expenses associated with attending this program are paid by a sponsoring American Legion post, a local business or another community-based organization.


American Legion Auxiliary Girls State

GIRLS STATE is a residential training program for high school girls and is held in almost all 50 states



every year. The objective is to provide "hands on" training in the management of a democratic government at city, county and state levels. Topics such as the structure of the various levels of government, simulated legislation, two-party politics and the workings of various government offices will be covered. A talent show and a career fair are also planned.

completed their junior year of high school in the upper 1/3 of their class and must be U.S. citizens residing in Maryland. They do not need to be a Junior member of the American Legion Auxiliary but non-resident Junior members of Maryland Units are also eligible. A young woman who is otherwise eligible but is not a U.S. citizen or who does not live



in Maryland (except MD Jr. Unit members) may attend.

SELECTION: is based on interest in government and the qualities of Leadership, Character, Honesty, Physical Fitness, Scholarship and Cooperativeness. Once you have received the information forms, it would be a good idea to interview the girls before making your selection. At the time of the interview make sure you have a completed application form, signed by the parent or quardian.

Chances are you will have more good prospects than you can afford to send. It's a good idea to select one or two alternates who can fill in if someone has to drop out. However, you might be able to find another local group or individual willing to provide funds so you can send them all.

INTERVIEW: the interested girls with at least one of their parents or guardians. Impress upon them that, although they will have a good time, this is a WEEK OF WORK and that they are expected to abide by the rules. Be sure to impress upon them that they should notify you IMMEDIATELY if for some reason they cannot attend in order to give a substitute time to get ready. Have them fill out the official application blank and sign waivers at this time. Once selected, they will need to provide a check for the \$35 registration fee made out to the sponsoring Unit. The registration fee is to be added to the Girls State fee and attached to the application when sent to Department. Be sure to tell the parents that there is a resident nurse on staff and a hospital near campus. Discuss transportation to and from Girls State. This is normally provided by the family, but should be arranged by the sponsoring Unit if necessary. Parents will also want to know that the college provides fine security arrangements.

ORIENTATION: will be held for all seven
Districts. Each applicant that is selected must attend
an orientation to attend Maryland Girls State. Dates
and locations will be available prior to the interview
process. These orientations will give an overview of
the Girls State program and the applicants will be
provided information packets that tells them where
and when to report, what to bring, and provides a
medical form for their doctor to complete.
